Legal basis for using your personal information

We have a legitimate interest in providing legal services to clients. Your data subject rights

- the right to object to the processing of your personal information where we are relying on a legitimate interest to do so and you think that your rights and interests outweigh our own and you wish us to stop
- the right to object if we process your personal information for the purposes of direct marketing
- the right to obtain from us a copy of all personal information which you have provided to us, providing processing of this information is based on your consent or on a contract, and providing the processing is carried out by automated means.
 Where technically feasible, you can request to have the information transmitted directly to another data controller
- the right not to be subjected to automated decision-making (with some exceptions).

If we request your consent to the processing of your personal data for a specific purpose, you have the right not to consent or to withdraw your consent later.
